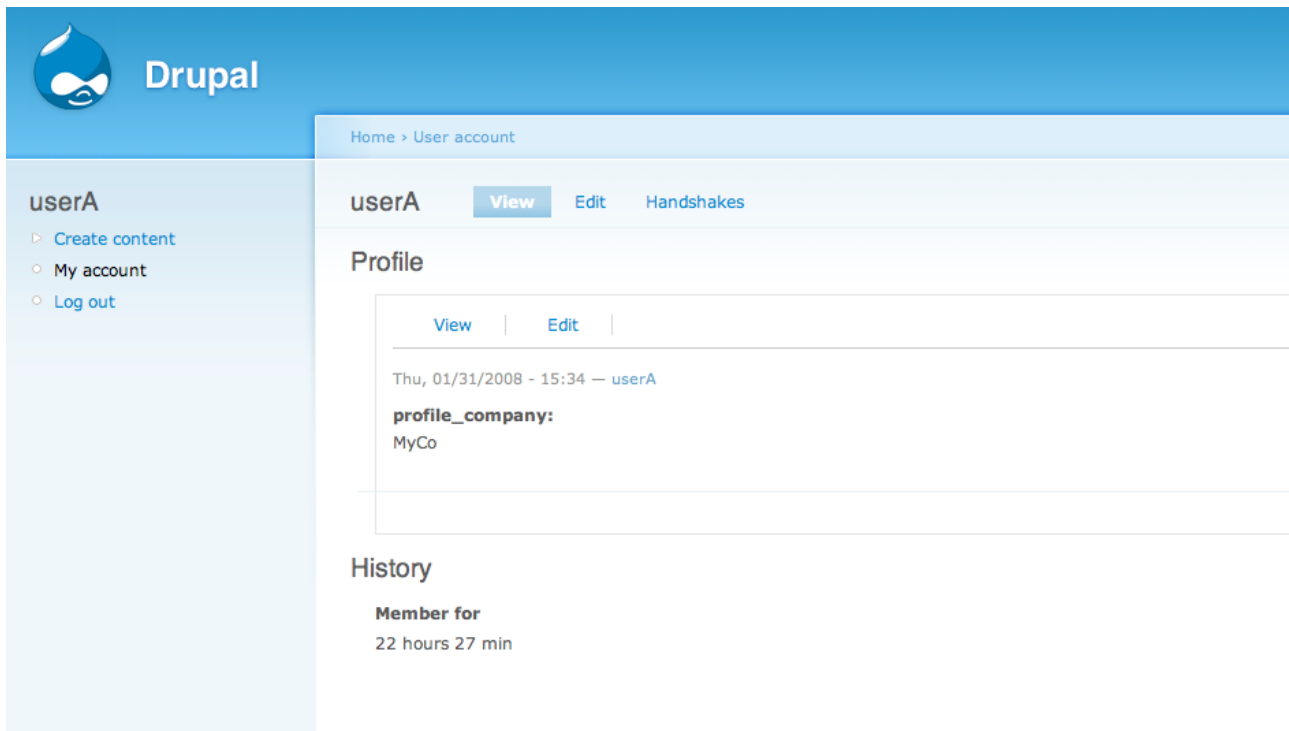

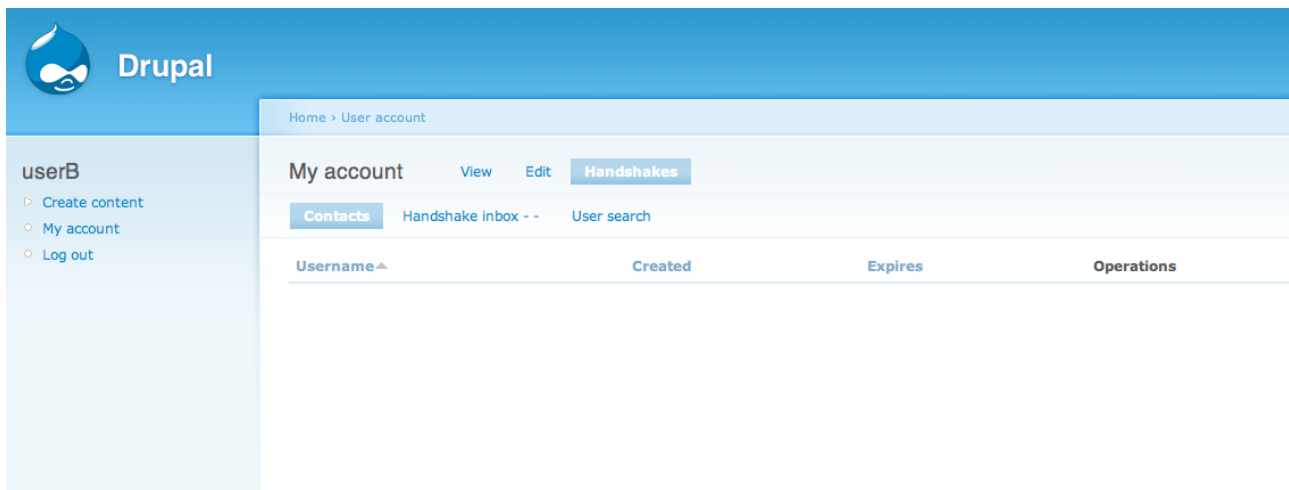

Views of personal profiles; userA and userB can view and edit their own profiles correctly (here we see userA account).



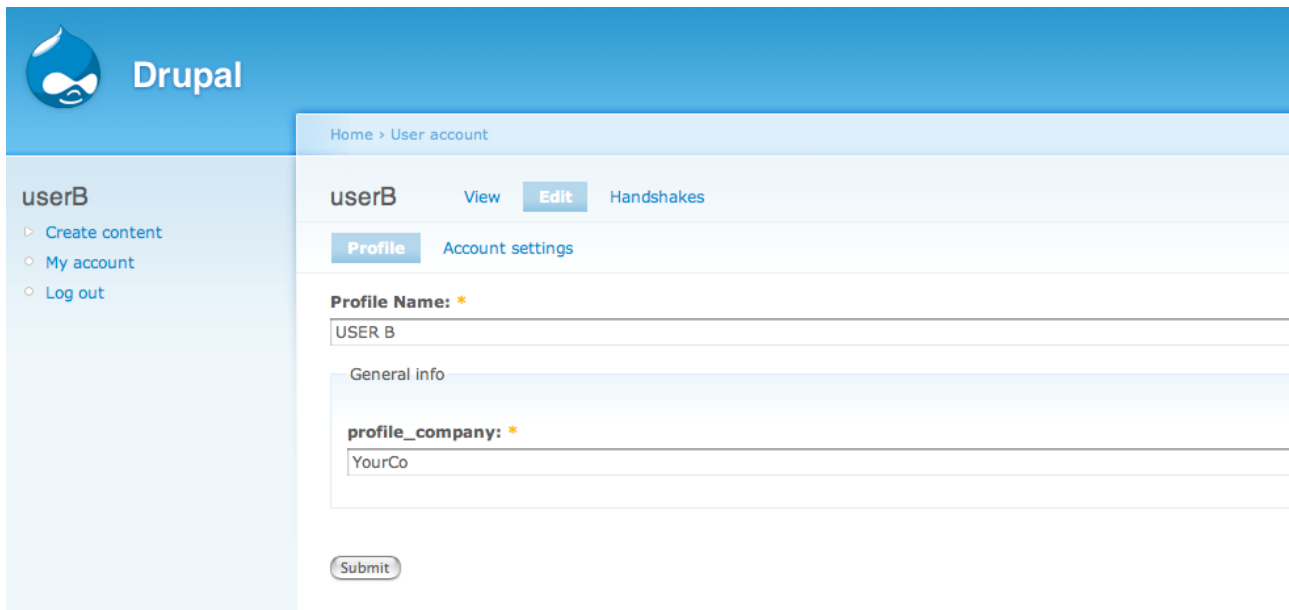

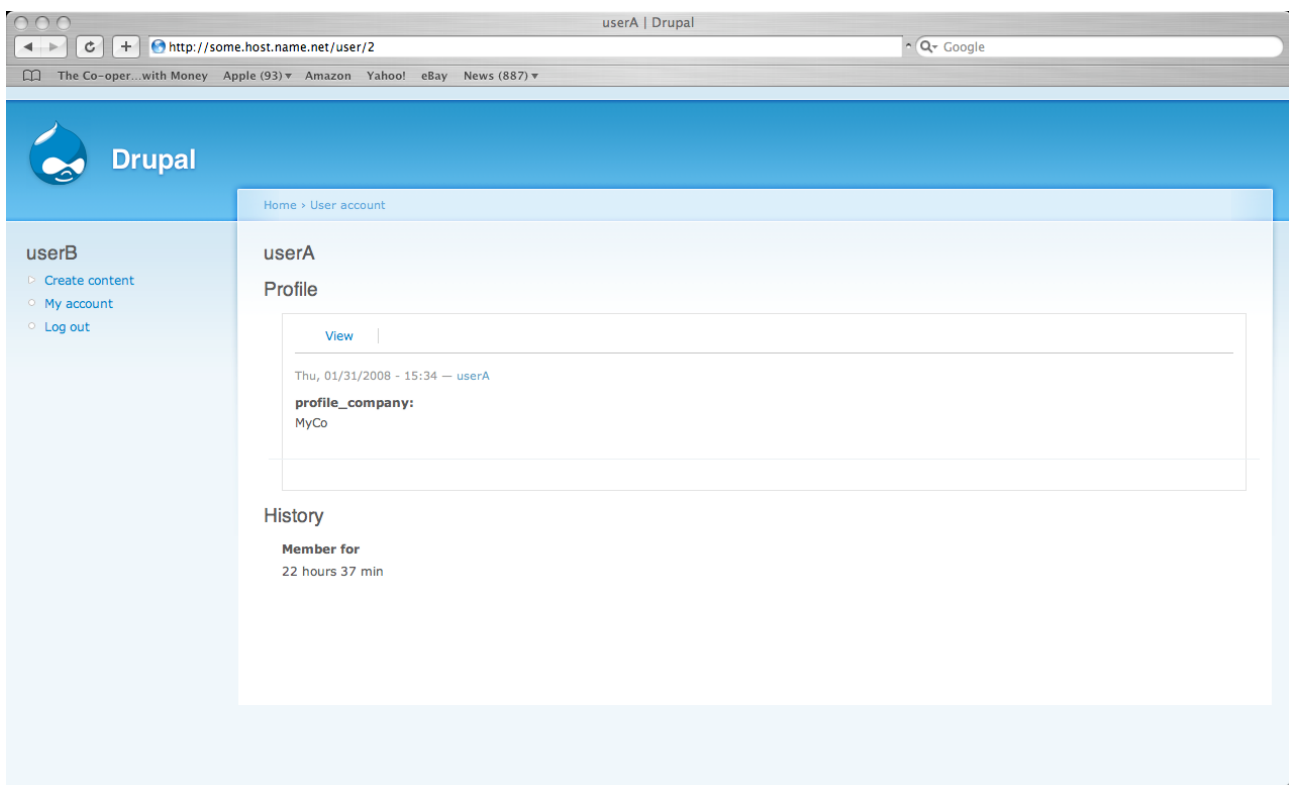
